2021 - Zonta Club of Trenton/Mercer Celebrating 90 Years All Year Long!

In April 1931, several women gathered in Trenton to start the adventure of founding the 112th club within Zonta International with the dream of enhancing the status of women locally and globally. Their dream of serving women in their community was strong. In the 1930's, they delivered free milk to moms during the Depression; lead the charge of the American Cancer Society's Field Army in cancer education; donated the funds for the first emergency vehicle in Mercer County; founded the Visiting Nurse Association in Mercer County; funded scholarships for women over 25; began the Zonta Club Community Grant to fund Zonta mission-conscious projects in Mercer County; and so much more!

90th Anniversary Project - Zonta Closet

To celebrate our 90th Anniversary, ZCTM began a partnership with The Children's Home Society of New Jersey, a long time partner in helping foster children, by creating the **Zonta Closet**. This project began in earnest in May 2021 and continued till October when we presented to Donna Pressma, CEO of CHSNJ, clothing, coats, shoes, diapers, wipes and books



for children aged newborn to 4 year old that would be served in the brand new Liberty Street Early Head Start Center in Trenton, NJ. There were even some hand-knit car seat blankets from our Sue Halsey! The items are intended as "emergency clothes" for children who, for whatever reason, become soiled during the day. The families will keep any clothes used for their children. The center will serve up to 80 children from low -income households. A van was required to take away all the items donated! In addition, ZCTM has donated and dedicated funds to replenish the clothes/ diapers as needed.

Book donations for the **Zonta Closet** will continue in April 2022 as it is the focus of the service project for attendees of the Area 1 and 2 workshops.

Zonta Fills 150 Backpacks

Zonta Club's continuing support of Franklin Elementary School in Trenton saw the members filling 150 backpacks to begin the 2021/2022 school year. The backpacks were prepared by Kathy Spence and Ellen Clark and along with Judy Levy were able to distribute to students in Aug.
